HELP PROTECT OUR DUNES & VEGETATION!

Our fragile dune beachgrass anchors sand in place and is damaged by foot and vehicle traffic, causing erosion. Without vegetation, dunes would be lost to the effects of wave, rain, and wind erosion. Dunes and vegetation are also home to a variety of animals, birds, insects and snakes.

- **DO NOT PARK, DRIVE OR WALK** on grass or plants east of A1A. Make sure your vehicle's tires are not parked on anything green. Allow room to walk around vehicle to avoid walking on grass. *Florida State Statute 161.053, Flagler Beach City Ordinance 5.02.04.*
- **DO NOT REMOVE OR CUT** any plants east of A1A. *Florida State Statute 161.242.*
- **ALWAYS USE STAIRS** to access beach. Do not walk, slide, jump or throw items down the dunes.
- There is **NO PARKING** on east side of A1A **from South 7th to South 28th.**
- **NO RV, SEMI, TRUCK, or TRAILER PARKING** is allowed east of A1A.
- **ALL OF ABOVE VIOLATIONS ARE PUNISHABLE BY UP TO \$500 FINE.**
- *Please* watch your children & dogs; do not allow them to play in dunes or on vegetation.
- *Please* remember that our crucial dune vegetation grows by the inch, but dies by the foot. It takes only 10 steps to destroy dune grass!
